Helping your child know this vital information will help them remain calm and get help should an emergency arise. It will help if your child knows what your name is as well. Many students only know their parents as “Mom” and “Dad.” Help your child be prepared to answer questions about where you live and who you are.

Counting Fun!

It's time to spill the beans! Open up a bag of beans and empty it out on a flat surface. Make groups of different sizes. It is great for practicing counting by ones, twos, threes or more if your child is ready! It is also great for little fingers and a lot of fun.

Put an odd number (less than 10) in a pile. Add on one bean at a time and count on. If your child can, encourage them to add two at a time!! It will help your little one gain a “sense of number” or how much something is. When we problem solve in older grades, students with a strong sense of number can visualize problems much easier. Give it a try and let me know how it goes!
